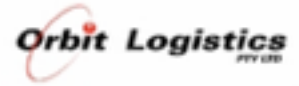

MATCH REPORTS - SENIORS

Last Saturday Seniors ventured out to Greenvale on what was promising to be an ordinary day weather wise. This included our U18 Div2 side playing Greenvale's second U18 team on their second oval. While there was no rain early, the ground was quite wet in patches and everyone knew we were going to be in for a tough day.

U18 Premier started well, Greenvale who are undefeated this season kicked with the wind in the first quarter and the boys did well to hold them to four goals for the quarter. At quarter time the boys were quite down on themselves but the coaching staff were positive about the quarter and looking forward to the second when we would have the breeze. Unfortunately this proved to be the decisive quarter as Greenvale would kick six goals into the breeze to our three with it. Eight goals down at half time, and this was pretty much the margin at the end of the game, as Greenvale had a four goal to one third quarter, and on a positive note the Marby boys were able to turn this around in the last to outscore Greenvale four goals to one. Good sides take advantage of every mistake you make and Greenvale certainly did this.

Reserve grade had another tough game against a top side. There were some good passages of play but they broke down going into the forward line and Greenvale generally scored from each turnover or mistake. A downpour during the second quarter didn't help as the ball became very slippery and hard to handle and scoring was tough. The boys battled it out. We also had a few U18s help out and they all did well.

The senior was two totally different halves. Right from the start our boys were very disciplined, not letting their opponents have time or space to set up play and creating numerous turnovers and scoring opportunities. Unfortunately we couldn't convert any of those into goals and at quarter time we were down by a goal, 1.5.11 to 0.5.5. The second quarter was a repeat of the first but Marby stepped up another level and generally led their opponents to the ball and we were able to score three goals to one to lead by 7 points at half time. The half time break proved the game changer. Whatever was said to the Greenvale team spurred them into action. With the ground drying out their midfield started to win some clear ball and their tall players marked everything in sight and the result was a nine goal quarter, putting the game way out reach. Robbie asked for a big effort at three quarter time but as hard as our boys tried, the taller, stronger, and much more experience Greenvale team had an answer. The result a fifteen goal to one half and a loss by 84 points. Again this shows that our young group are very capable but have plenty to work on against the better teams who make the most of every opportunity. Now for a week off for the split round and facing the unbeaten Aberfeldie at home on July 25.

On a positive note the U18 Div2 had a really strong win against Greenvale so the day wasn't a complete washout. After a slow start they restricted Greenvale to two goals after quarter time while we kicked ten goals and 20 behinds in the last three quarters. A fifty point win could have been bigger but for some wayward kicking for goal. They have now won four games and meet Aberfeldie at Aberfeldie this Saturday at 9.30am.
